Burlington Bridge Club, Inc. Minutes of Board Meeting November 13, 2024

CALL TO ORDER AND ATTENDANCE:

The meeting was called to order on Zoom at 7:00 PM by President Mark Oettinger. Those in attendance were Mark Oettinger, Steve Ackerman, Don Sharp, Donna Hale, and Stuart Showalter.

OLD BUSINESS: None

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Friday and Monday games

- a. Discussion centered around possible changes to the schedule for the Friday game, which has been attracting only about 3 to 3.5 tables in recent weeks and once just two tables. A recent survey of all BBC members showed no consensus on how to improve attendance, but there was some support for a 12:30 PM start time in lieu of the current 10 AM. Donna will ask the Friday players this week whether they would be willing to try starting at 12:30 on a trial basis. A final decision remains pending.
- b. It was decided not to make changes to the Monday game because it has been relatively well attended recently.

2. Incentives to increase attendance

- a. It was suggested that we should give a "free play" to first-time attendees, players returning after a considerable absence, and members who recruit new or returning players. It was agreed that the director in charge shall have the right to award free plays on a case-by-case basis. This will be communicated to the directors.
- b. Mark will appoint a committee to study other ways to increase attendance at all games. Possible committee members are Mary Tierney, Lucy Trombley, Ken Kaleita, and Phil Sharpsteen.

3. Directors' pay

- a. The club has been paying the directors \$40 per session for quite a while, and it was decided that this figure should be increased to \$50 per session beginning Monday, November 18. The rate for directing BBO games will be \$40.
- b. The directors received a Christmas bonus last year, and whether to continue that practice was discussed briefly. No final action was taken except to say that the Treasurer may use his discretion to decide.
- c. In addition, it was decided to increase the fee for setting up boards on the dealing machine from \$5 to \$6 per set.

4. Etiquette and Zero Tolerance

The board broke into an executive session to discuss issues relating to compliance with the ACBL's Zero Tolerance policy. No specific action was taken; however, Mark will draft a memo to directors encouraging them to be more active in enforcing this policy.
