They were followed by Michael Rogers, Nick Ecker-Racz, Ingi Agnarsson, Phil Sharpsteen, Paul Reardon, and Peter Allen, each of whom earned more than ten.

October's calendar features a "Senior Pairs" even on **Thursday**, **October 10**. It will be an **Open game**, not our usual 999 Thursday game. All players must be 60 or older (not an issue for most of us), and the overall and District 25 leaders will earn silver points. Due to the increased cost of the ACBL sanction for this event, the entry fee will be \$7 per person.

There will also be opportunities for extra master points in several "Club Championship" games in the coming months. We are allowed two such games per sanctioned session per quarter. The dates are listed on the BBC website by opening the Calendar page.

Meet a Member

Stuart Showalter learned bridge from his parents while in high school. He played social bridge through college and graduate school, but then his career and family (two sons and one daughter) took priority and interrupted his enjoyment of the game for more than three decades.

He spent the 1970s in the Navy successfully defending Great Lakes Naval Station, the Navy Hospital San Diego, JAG Headquarters in Arlington, VA, and the Navy Surgeon General in Washington, DC. He adds, with tongue in cheek, "The Viet Cong didn't get past Guam during my entire term of naval service."

In 1980 Stuart took a job with a healthcare association in St. Louis, MO. He had a brief stint in a law firm in the mid-90s but then moved on to work in compliance and risk management for healthcare systems in Orlando, FL, and Baton Rouge, LA. He retired in 2010 to be near his parents in Roswell, GA, and after they passed away, he returned to San Diego in 2012 and resumed his acquaintance with bridge, almost by accident.

"I was walking in Balboa Park one day and saw a sign advertising bridge games six days a week," he says. "I called and found out that they gave beginner lessons, which I sorely needed since much had changed since the days of Charles Goren." For the next eight years he played regularly at the Redwood Bridge Club, San Diego, and in Unit 539 games in La Jolla. He even served as the secretary of the Unit board.

When his daughter and family moved from San Jose, CA, to Williston, Showalter followed immediately, arriving here in March 2020. He was pleased to discover that the BBC is just half a mile from his new apartment.

Stuart plays regularly in BBC and Unit 175 games, has joined the Unit and BBC boards, and attends occasional tournaments here in New England. He plans to attend the NABC in Las Vegas, this coming December.

When "Manager Emeritus" Don Sharp wanted to step down he tapped Stuart to be his successor.

"I'm amazed at the amount of detail that goes into running a bridge club," he says, adding, "I'm grateful for the help that Don and our great directors give me. The job would be overwhelming without them."

"Bridge is my one hobby,"
Stuart says. "I'd be really bored and boring without it. Thanks to the Burlington Bridge Club I can come out of my introvert shell and act like a regular member of society." ■

The BBC is well known for being a friendly, welcoming club, and we think a few reminders about etiquette can make it even more so.

We begin with a mention of ACBL's **Zero Tolerance Policy**. The Z-T Policy applies to all ACBL tournaments and sanctioned clubs. Its purpose is to create a pleasant atmosphere for everyone. This includes commendable behavior such as:

- Being a good "host" or "guest" at each table
- Greeting others in a friendly manner
- Praising the bidding and/or play of the opponents
- Having your convention card available for the opps to review (this is *required*, not just a nicety)
